

ADVANCED PLACEMENT CONTRACT- CHEMISTRY

Advanced Placement courses are the most rigorous classes offered at a high school. These courses are dedicated to challenging highly motivated students to do college level work while still in high school. The AP courses challenge students with a course of study that parallels the curriculum in college and university classes. By taking AP level courses in high school, students are better prepared to succeed academically in college, place out of freshman-level classes, and earn scholarships. They require a considerable amount of commitment and outside-of-class effort. Because of this, it is important that student and parents agree to commit the time and energy needed to complete the course successfully. Students who wish to be considered for an AP class must agree to the criteria set forth in the course contract.
